Purpose:

This event allows participants to present an informative topic related to horticulture in a demonstrative way. Students present their project to a panel of judges and then receive questions.

Rules and Guidelines:

1. Each FFA Chapter is invited to enter TWO demonstrations. If two teams are registered, they must be in different divisions.
2. Demonstrations are presented by either one individual contestant or a team of two contestants.
3. Contestants may be any active FFA member who is enrolled in an agricultural education course during the school term preceding entry in the contest.
4. No individual may present the same demonstration in successive years.
5. Presentations must be of a demonstration nature (actually doing something), not simply an illustrated talk.
6. Demonstration topics may deal with fruits, vegetables, nuts, flowers, ornamental plants, turf within any of the following areas:

- a. **Production:** Crop production or soil management.
 - b. **Marketing:** Crop marketing or preparation for storage or exhibition.
 - c. **Use:** Food crop preparation for fresh use or processing or floral material preservation.
 - d. **Artistic Arrangement:** Artistic arrangement of live or dried products in arrangements, corsages, or plaques. Artificial plants and flowers are not allowed, but ceramic and natural ornaments may be used.
 - e. **Landscaping:** Landscaping, installation, and plant maintenance within and around the home, business, or public grounds.
 - f. **Middle School Division** (may choose to present a topic related to any of the above categories).
7. Each demonstration is limited to 12 minutes. Following the demonstration, the judges (only) may ask questions of the contestant(s) and only about the demonstration for 3 minutes.
 8. Contestants must provide all equipment and materials required for their demonstrations.
 9. All categories will be limited to the first 10 entries in each category.
 10. No individual may present the same presentation as presented in the agriscience demonstration contest.

Judging/Scoring Criteria:

- The Horticulture Demonstration contest is judged using the attached rubric.

Awards:

*Cash Awards for Top 3 in each category.
(will be split if awarded to a team of two):*

1st Place - \$20

2nd Place - \$10

3rd Place - \$5

Ribbons for Junior and Senior:

1st - 6th Place - Rosette Ribbons
